

## Supply List – 6th, 7th and 8th Grades

### ***Each Student Should Have the Following Items for Field Studies***

- Backpack and water bottle
- A small first aid kit (ziploc bag with some bandages)

*\*Students should come to school on their travel day (Tuesday or Thursday) dressed for the outdoors with a sack lunch and possible rain gear. You can buy a sack lunch in the cafeteria.*

- 12" ruler (centimeter/inches) – must have
- Pencil sharpener (hand held)
- Pencils – a constant supply all year long
